Our awards included one for an increase in membership numbers once again, and also included an award for exceeding our per capita targets for the Elks National Foundation (ENF).

Our Chairman's Challenge Award landed us in the Elks Magazine as we had the second highest score in the nation for Lodges of our size!! Congratulations to all of you for your fine charitable work and generosity.

Because of the generosity and care our members and leaders have demonstrated over

the life of our organization, the Elks National Foundation (ENF) is now worth over \$594 million dollars. ENF is able to distribute interest only on this amount, preserving the principal. Our local Lodges receive funds from ENF to make our communities better places. In 2013, that amount distributed to Local Lodges through grants was \$8.68 million. Every year lodges have access to funds provided by ENF that actually may outweigh their members' contributions!

At the State convention we were reminded of many grants available to Local Lodges. To obtain such grants, requests need to be completed by the requesting Lodge. If we have a great cause and feel ENF should provide us with one of these grants, we can apply and receive these additional funds.

We are great contributors, let's ensure that our community reaps the rewards of our generosity!
