FLAG DAY SUNDAY, JUNE 15TH @ 11AM FUNCTION ROOM, DOUG KIRKPATRICK

On June 14, 1777 the Second Continental Congress passed the Flag Resolution for the US so that our ships would not be con-



fused with British warships. The original flag had thirteen stars and thirteen stripes, a star and stipe for each of the colonies. Only one flag in our history had more than thirteen stripes. That flag had fifteen, one for each of the two new states, Vermont & Kentucky, which had been admitted to the country by 1772. In the early days of our nation there had been a number of different flags which represented

various parts of our nation. The Elks Flag Day ritual covers the history of ALL of the flags which our country has embraced. The City of Portsmouth is prominently mentioned in this ritual as well as John Paul Jones' association with our town. A prominent historical site in the city is the boarding house where he resided during the construction of his ship Ranger.

All members of our lodge, especially new members, should make all efforts to attend this ceremony. Members of other patriotic organizations as well as officials are usually in attendance. The presentation is quite extensive and informative in its portrayal of the complete history of our flag from early colonial times to the present. This is a moving ceremony and only takes about an hour.
