REMINDER

In accordance with State Liquor Laws, all non-members MUST BE SIGNED IN by a member. This includes spouses and significant others. A member can sign in up to four guests. Members who sign in a guest are responsible for their guest. Guests must leave when the sponsoring member leaves, unless another member signs the guest in and assumes the responsibility for that guest. **NOTE:** DELINQUENT or UNAFFILIATED (dropped) Elks CANNOT be signed in as a guest. If delinquent,

they must pay their dues, if unaffiliated, they must be reinstated. **REMEMBER:** If your guest is not your spouse or significant other, you can only sign them in three times – after that they must either join the Lodge or stop coming in as a guest.

SECRETARY'S NOTES CONTINUED

- Application fee is \$25 we require \$10 upon completion of the application, the remaining \$15 will be collected at Initiation. Once application is completed and the partial fee is collected, give the application to the bartender and make sure she/he issues a receipt for the \$10.
- 2) The Elks year runs April 1 March 31st.
- 3) Annual Dues are \$60 (If you are initiated during the year, the dues are pro-rated)
- 4) Once a date is determined for Investigation/Initiation a letter is sent to all candidates. Please note: we do not hold these every month, it depends on the number of applicants, so there can be a delay from the time we receive their application to the time a letter is sent out (could be a month or more)
- Remind them to keep their receipt so they may come to the Lodge while awaiting Investigation/ Initiation

GRAND LODGE RESOLUTION NOTICE TO MEMBERSHIP

At the Grand Lodge Convention in July, the membership approved 17 resolutions. Please see elks.org for the resolutions. Resolution # 3 re-

quires a by-law change and must be voted on by our membership. Only the rituals prepared and approved by the Ritualistic Committee of the Grand Lodge shall be used in opening and closing a Lodge, initiation of candidates, installation of Lodge Officers and institution of a new Lodge. Local Lodges may through their By-Laws adopt alternative rituals.

The Grand Lodge has prepared a shortened ritual which is available for review on the Elks.org website. We will be holding a vote at our next meeting on Tuesday, September 11th at 6:30. As a membership, we have 3 options: 1. To accept the change and go to the shortened format. 2. To not accept the change. or 3. 
